TERM THREE-RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

We we will begin this term with the Religious Education Unit 'God Provides for All'. In this unit we will wonder at the spectacularly beautiful in creation, the abundant resources the Earth contains and ways in which these resources may not be shared fairly. This will lead us to wonder at the God who created the Earth and celebrate what has been revealed about God, who intends to provide for all. We will also explore the ways in which Jesus taught us to care for those in need and gave himself in the Eucharist to help people to do this. You can support your child during this unit by, for example:

- highlighting agencies that support those in need e.g. Caritas and LifeLink
- participating in the celebration of the Eucharist
- during family prayer time, praying for those who lack the resources for life.





FRUITS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT


Our Fruit of the Holy Spirit focus for the first five weeks of Term 3 is 'Love'. Love comes in many forms. We exhibit the virtue of love by our unselfish devotion and care for ourselves, each other, and God.

May we meet each other with a smile, and a loving attitude to all we meet!

LITERACY

This term we be building on our work on narratives. Students will closely examine the features of narratives and identify successful techniques to use in their own writing pieces in order to create tension and suspense. They will create an interactive book with multiple endings using their narratives, complete with sounds and images.

Later in the term, our literacy will focus on persuasive writing which will link with our Integrated Studies unit 'Making Democracy. We will be looking at persuasive writing in order to effectively participate in a formal debate, expressing our point of view in relation to issues both in the classroom and the wider community.





NUMERACY

This term we begin working with fractions, decimals and percentages. This will involve ordering, converting and comparing numbers and working with money problems involving finding percentages of whole numbers. To finish the term, we will be focusing on probability and data representation. Here we will be describing probabilities using fractions, decimals and percentages as well as conducting chance experiments.

We will continue our whole school approach to learning and mastering timetables. In addition to this, we will also be completing a weekly times table challenge in Year 6.

MAI groups will focus on improving students addition and subtraction skills through a variety of engaging educational activities.



INTEGRATED STUDIES

It is important to understand the values of our community, the rules that are designed to protect our rights and the responsibilities that we have to others. To enable us to be effective democratic citizens, we need to understand the values and principles of democracy that guide the communities in which we live. Students will understand their role as active citizens who are able to vote and make decisions about what happens in their lives. They will see democracy in action within a classroom and in their school, as well as understanding, in a broader way, democratic processes that take place in local, state and federal governance.



PURPOSEFUL PRACTICE


In Term Three we will be continuing with our whole school approach to Purposeful Practice.
